<b>Teleological</b> - Situation Ethics is not concerned with following rules but with bringing about good	
Situationist as opposed to legalistic or antinomian	
Agape - " goodwill at work in partnership with reason" in seeking the "neighbour's best interest with a careful eye to all the factors in the situation".	
Four working principles:	
1. Pragmatism	
2. Relativism  3. Positivism	
4. Personalism	

Six fundamental principles:	
<ul> <li>Love only is always good         <ul> <li>Only one 'thing' is intrinsically good; namely, love: nothing else at all'</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Love is the only norm (rule)     'The ruling norm of Christian decision is love: nothing else'	
<ul> <li>Love and justice are the same "Love and justice are the same, for justice is love distributed, nothing else."</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Love is not liking "Love wills the neighbor's good whether we like him or not."</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Love justifies the means</li> <li>"Only the end justifies the means; nothing else,"</li> </ul>	
Love decides there and then
