1. All our actions are causally determined

Baron d'Holbach (18th Century)

- (a) human beings are purely physical
- (b) therefore they are wholly governed by physical laws
- (c) therefore they are governed by laws 'over which they have no control'

Determinism means 'everything has a cause' and 'same cause, same effect'. Is this true?

Leibniz argued 'we are inclined but not necessitated'.

Descartes said our minds are not governed by deterministic relationships.

Particle physics asserts that at the level of elementary particles, physics is not deterministic.

2. Because of this, we are not free

Holbach:

- I. our actions are caused by our wills
- II. our wills are caused by our motives
- III. our motives are caused by external factors over which we have no control

If we accept that our motives are caused by external factors over which we have no control, does that mean that we have no control over our motives? This is a very important point, and needs to be thought about very carefully!!
